# Address by Retiring President

MERLE J. ABBETT

## To the Indiana High School Athletic Association

It has been a distinct pleasure to me to serve in various capacities over a period of several years this fine, big organization—the Indiana High School Athletic Association.

It has enjoyed phenomenal growth during the last few years and has accomplished great good in our schools with our boys and girls. There are still many problems that must be faced; some of which have come with its increased scope of activity and some as old or older than the organization itself.

The primary purpose of the organization certainly is to better care for the needs of the boys, teach them fine manhood, develop finer standards of sportsmanship, strong ideals that will function in later life and sturdier physical bodies. This can not be accomplished, and is not accomplished by a governing body, principal, coach, or well meaning fan working alone but by the good work of each, and the splendid help of each must not be lost sight of. A hearty co-operation of each functioning in their proper sphere gives us the combined force which has worked wonders for all of us and will continue to.

The open forum in our annual meeting has furnished us all a basis to correct our individual school ills in athletics and has many times furnished us the basis for proper growth and adjustment. The support that the Board has received from the principals and coaches has been wonderful and helpful.

The program which I am here suggesting is the result of expressions from many of the finest type principals and coaches. If we are to go forward, and I trust we will ever, we must sit tight on a radical departure from a well known and defined policy, which has in almost every way been a success.

First: There is need for help in some sections of our state. This need in all cases is not financial but in some cases it is. In such cases after proper investigation, I suggest that we could help them in many ways from the treasury of the Indiana High School Athletic Association. The real need however may be to help them get across with their athletic policy in their own communities which they may have been working on. Those of us who may have this already developed may recall the problems we had to face and lend encourage-

ment. I see no reason why these boys should not have gymnasiums, better physical training and better recreational programs for the summer. Some of these boys must drive several miles to even have the benefit of a gymnasium for practice. We can not build these but we can help in creating a proper sentiment for them. The athletic association has funds that could be used in carrying proper publicity to all parts of the state, provide speakers on our institute programs who would further the interests of the schools in physical training and recreational work. Ours is not an organization for basketball alone but even the most critical must admit it has made possible a gymnasium in many communities which if rightly used will be used every hour in the day and part of the time at night to serve boys and girls, also to serve the community in this same interest. I see in the suggestion of a division of the funds coming from our tourneys on basis of the ticket sale sold by the several schools and to their fans much merit and I am sure that we could help the above situation by a proper distribution on the above basis. We should never fail to keep up our high standard of entertainment and dispensing good fellowship in these centers at sectional tourney time and should not cripple these however, by not seeing merit in a proper consideration for all schools participating.

Second: The members of the board could, (with only their expenses paid) visit the schools of their district and thus come in contact with the problems and help with kindly criticism and suggestion. the principals and coaches who are fighting against odds perhaps to help their boys. There are many situations that would not need this but there are certainly some that could be helped by it, and I suspect that we might be helped ourselves as members of the Board. This should be done by individuals who have a desire to help and not to pick out flaws or faults. Most of us have enough to do to set our own situations right and too much time is often spent in fault finding and unpleasant criticism which is never helpful. We should also bear in mind that our school is just one unit of a great big whole and that we view any situation in the light of all others concerned. It is not our duty, neither is it our right as principals to be selfish in our desires and try to force certain issues to the detriment of others. Bear in mind that your situation is one, there are 642 others, just as good, and trying to get the same place.

Third: There are many evils which need our attention collectively and individually. Gambling exists and follows basketball as many other activities. There is no place for this and we should neither permit nor tolerate its existence.

This organization is for all lines of activity and an evil may arise when we become top heavy in one branch, since we are very apt to limit the number of boys we reach. This number should be several times five.

The schedules in basketball in many cases are too long and cer-

tainly we have more immature boys than our western conference which limits the number of games to be played in one season.

When it gets to the point that one activity takes the stage entirely in a school or community, it is certainly time to be reminded that scholarship is primary and these other things secondary. Our athletic program should strengthen and support our educational growth, never weaken or substitute for it.

Let us remember that in these times we should keep level heads, support the men we elect to our Board of Control and our permanent secretary.

As a retiring member of the Board of Control, I wish to thank all those who have by their kindly support and helpful suggestions made this a year of wonderful growth and enthusiasm. It has been one in which more boys have been helped in physical body, in mental attitude, in spirit of unselfishness, in an attitude farther away from the "here stu~~ff~~," and have been encouraged to go forward in life better young men in every way.

Announcement of I. H. S. A. A. Sectional, Regional and  
Final Basket Ball Tournaments, 1921.

## THE TENTH ANNUAL

The Board of Control has completed the details for the State  
Championship Basket Ball Tournaments and announces the scheme in  
full:

### SECTIONAL TOURNEYS MARCH 4 AND 5

The following bases were used in selecting centers:

(1) Location—geographical and with reference to schools de-  
siring to participate. (2) Railways and interurban facilities. (3)  
General conditions—attitude of local authorities, floors, entertaining  
facilities, etc.

Schools have been assigned by counties with the intention of  
having no more than 16 teams in each Tourney. The following  
scheme gives the Centers and also the counties assigned to each  
center. The name of your county locates your center. The Board  
reserves the right to readjust the scheme if conditions make it advi-  
sable and necessary. The numbers indicate the schools from each  
county that have expressed their desire to enter at the present time.

**Management**—The management of these Tourneys rests solely with the Board of Control. Local arrangements have been delegated to the Center Principals. Two officials for each Tourney will be

selected by the Board and none but fair, disinterested and competent men will be chosen. All schedules of Hours, Floors, Teams and officials will be made out and printed by the Board. All schedules will be drawn by lot and no changes will be made in them.

**Open Contest**—The Tourneys are open to all members of the Association, irrespective of their season's record.

**Protests**—All protests against teams or individuals must be made in writing and filed with the Permanent Secretary on or before February 25, at 11 a. m. Protests must be accompanied by evidence.

**Entertainment**—Teams are limited to eight men, but ten men can be certified to. The Center Principals have contracted with the Board to entertain nine men (which must include the faculty manager) from each competing school. Entertainment will begin, if necessary, at 7 a. m. Friday, March 4, and continue, if necessary, to 8 a. m. Sunday, March 6. Printed schedules will be sent to each competing school in plenty of time to arrange for making the trip, etc. All competing schools are requested to ask for no longer entertainment than is necessary, but all schools are entitled to entertainment throughout the Tourney.

**Expenses**—An entrance fee of one (1) dollar for each team must accompany the entry blank, which money will go into the treasury of the I. H. S. A. A. to defray expenses of the Tourneys incurred by the Board of Control. The Center Principals have contracted to pay transportation expenses of the competing schools according to the following conditions:

After all expenses, save those of transportation, have been paid a balance shall be ascertained. The first one hundred (100) dollars or part thereof in this balance shall belong to the Center High School. If there is more than one hundred (100) dollars in the balance, the transportation expenses of the competing schools shall be paid of such part thereof as the balance prorated will give each school, the Tourney Center not sharing. Any balance yet remaining after \$75 is paid to the I. H. S. A. A. shall belong to the Center High School.

**Privileges**—All competing teams, one rubber, and one faculty manager from each team are to be admitted free to all games.

**Eligibility**—The eligibility of each player must be certified to by the Principal of the school sending the team. Certificates must be made on the regular blanks furnished by the Permanent Secretary, and all data must be given as indicated. Entries will close Monday, February 21. This means that they must be in the hands of the Permanent Secretary complete in every detail on that date. All students must be eligible when they participate.

**Admission Fee**—The admission fee to all Tourney games shall be thirty-five (35) cents for single session tickets and one (1) dollar and fifty (50) cents for season tickets and no more shall be received for said tickets. No more tickets shall be so'd than the capacity of the house will justify.

**Prizes**—No prizes of any kind are to be awarded to any school or individual from any source.

**Distribution of Tickets**—An equitable distribution of tickets shall be made among the competing schools based on distance, enrollment in High School, and probable attendance from the competing schools. Any unfair methods or prices higher than those mentioned in this announcement should be reported to the Board of Control with evidence.

**Warnings**—Entries close Monday, February 21, and cannot be changed afterwards. An entrance fee of \$1.00 must accompany each entry blank. Special privileges will not be granted to anyone. Send all entry blanks and money to A. L. Trester, LaPorte, Ind. All data must be given on entry blank.

## REGIONAL TOURNEYS, PURDUE AND INDIANA, MARCH 12

**Entrants**—The winning teams of the Sectional Tourneys shall constitute the participants in the Regional Tourneys. ## ARTICLES OF CONTRACT

LaPorte, Indiana, .....1921.

The following Articles of Agreement are subscribed to by the Board of Control of the Indiana High School Athletic Association through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, and Principal ..... representing ..... High School.

### SECTION I.

The dates of the Indiana Sectional High School Basket Ball Tourneys shall be Friday and Saturday, March 4 and 5, 1921.

### SECTION II.

The State High School Board of Control through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, shall furnish the High School representatives with lists of qualified teams and the names of the men on the respective teams, on or before Tuesday, March 1.

### SECTION III.

The High School representative shall provide free entertainment for the respective teams of nine men, which shall include one Faculty Manager for each team, between the hours of 7 a. m., Friday, March 4 and 8 a. m., Sunday, March 6. If possible this period of entertainment will be shortened by the Board of Control. All teams are entitled to entertainment throughout the tourney.

### SECTION IV.

The High School representative shall provide tickets, door-men, ushers, announcers, scorers, timekeepers, basket balls, and all necessary equipment for the games. No prizes whatever are to be given.

### SECTION V.

The matter of complimentary tickets shall be in the hands of the High School representative, who shall issue them to the Press, the officials, and to the helping students. All men of the competing teams, one rubber and one Faculty Manager for each team, are to be admitted to the tourney.

### SECTION VI.

The I. H. S. A. A. Board of Control shall select the officials for the games not included in Section 4.

### SECTION VII.

The admission fee to all Tourney games shall be thirty-five (35)

cents for single session tickets and one dollar and fifty (\$1.50) cents for season tickets.

#### SECTION VIII.

The High School representative shall pay to each Referee at the close of his work the sum of fifty (\$50) dollars only. There will be two referees assigned to each Tourney. Entertainment, traveling and hotel expenses are to be paid by the officials.

#### SECTION IX.

After all legitimate expenses, save those for the travel of the competing teams, have been paid a balance shall be ascertained, and if such proves to be more than one hundred (\$100) dollars the transportation expenses of the competing schools shall be paid by the High School Representative. If the amount of the balance above one hundred (\$100) dollars is not sufficient to pay all of the transportation expenses, this amount shall be distributed pro rata among the competing schools, the Center school not sharing in this distribution. If the amount above one hundred (\$100) dollars is more than sufficient to pay all transportation expenses this amount shall be divided as follows: The first \$75.00 or part thereof shall go to the I. H. S. A. A. and the remainder shall belong to the High School representative. The \$100.00 referred to above shall belong to the High School holding the Tourney. The Board reserves the right to judge what expenses are legitimate.

#### SECTION X.

The High School under whose auspices the Tourney is held promises hearty cooperation with the State Board of Control and the State Board of Control promises as much to the High School conducting the Tourney.

#### SECTION XI.

The details of all Tourneys, such as protests, eligibility lists, schedules, etc., are to be cared for by the State Board of Control.

#### SECTION XII.

The State Board of Control shall manage all Tourneys, and the High Schools are to work under this direction.

#### SECTION XIII.

The High School representative shall send by telegram the name of the winning school to A. L. Trester, LaPorte, Indiana, as soon as the Tournament is completed. All entry blanks must be sent to A. L. Trester by special delivery Saturday evening, March 5th. The High School representative shall also send to A. L. Trester on or before Tuesday, March 8, the complete scores of all games, a complete and itemized statement of receipts and disbursements, and a check as called for in Section IX.

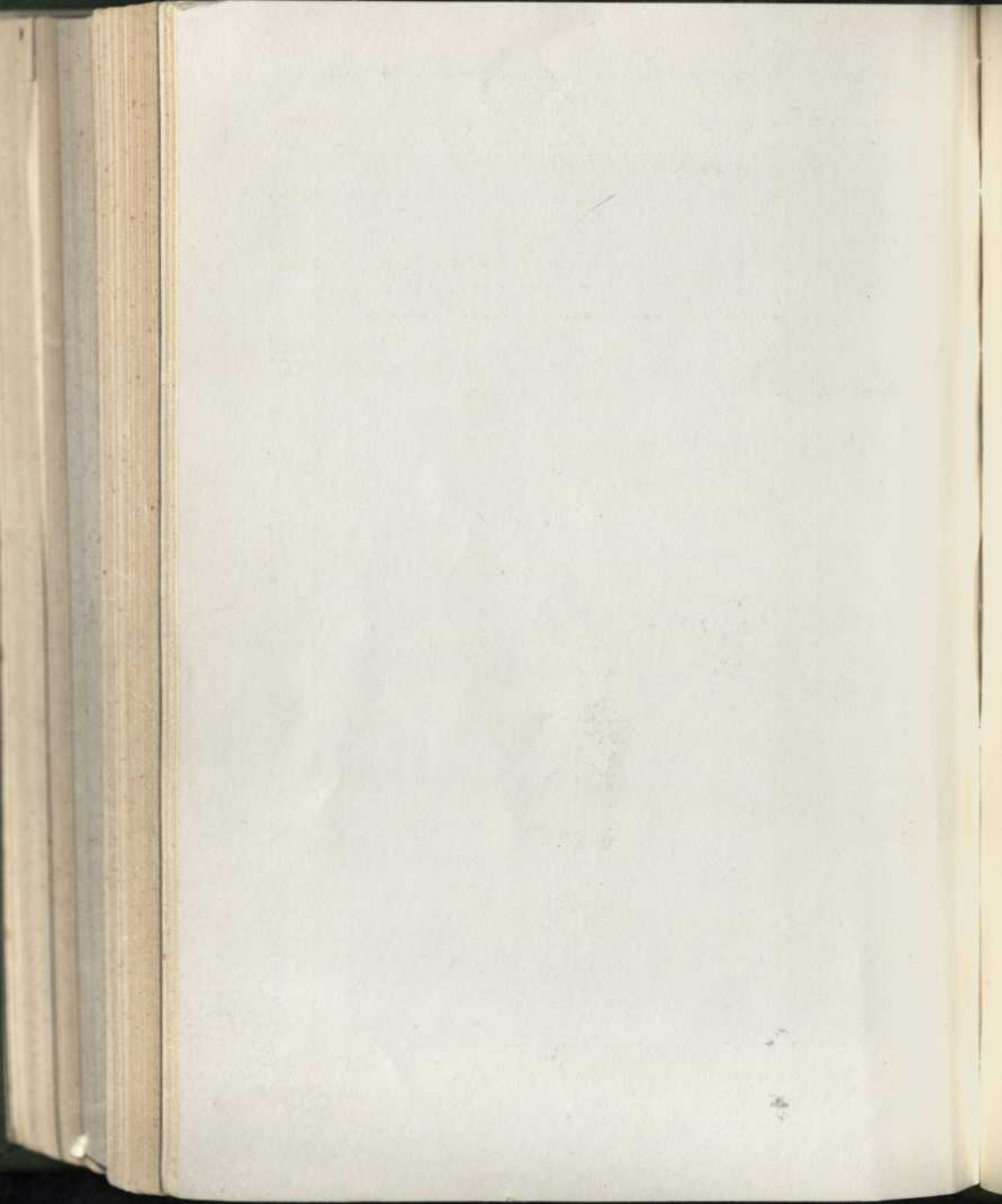

# I. H. S. A. A. Basket Ball Semi-Final Series Contract

## ARTICLES OF CONTRACT

LaPorte, Indiana, December 3, 1920.

The following articles of agreement are subscribed to by the Board of Control of the Indiana High School Athletic Association through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, and..... representing..... University.

### SECTION I.

The date of the Indiana High School Semi-final Basket Ball Series shall be Saturday, March 12, 1920.

### SECTION II.

The State High School Board of Control through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, shall furnish the University Representative with lists of qualified teams and the names of the men on the respective teams on or before Tuesday, March 8.

### SECTION III.

The University representative shall provide free entertainment for the respective teams of nine men, which shall include one Faculty Manager for each team, between the hours of 6 p. m. Friday, March 11 and 8 a. m., Sunday, March 13. If possible this period of entertainment will be shortened by the Board of Control. All teams are entitled to entertainment throughout the Series.

### SECTION IV.

The University representative shall provide tickets, door men, ushers, announcers, scorers, time-keepers, basket balls, and all necessary equipment for the games. No prizes whatever are to be given by any one.

### SECTION V.

The matter of complimentary tickets shall be in the hands of the University representative, who shall issue them to the Press, the officials, and to the helping students. All men of the competing teams and one Faculty Manager for each team are to be admitted free to the Series.

### SECTION VI.

The I. H. S. A. A. Board of Control shall select the officials for the games not included in Section IV.

### SECTION VII.

The admission fee to all Tourney games shall be fifty (50) cents for single session tickets and one dollar (\$1.00) for season tickets.

### SECTION VIII.

The University representative shall pay to each Referee at the close of his work the sum of fifty (50) dollars only. There will be two referees and their entertainment is to be paid by the officials.

### SECTION IX.

All legitimate expenses other than traveling expenses shall be paid by the University representative. If there should be a deficit in doing this the I. H. S. A. A. shall reimburse the University to the extent of 50 per cent. of the deficit. If there should be a balance such shall be divided pro rata among the competing schools for traveling expenses to the extent of the expenses only. Any further balance shall be divided fifty-fifty between the two parties to this contract.

### SECTION X.

The University under whose auspices the Series is held promises hearty co-operation with the State Board of Control and the State Board of Control promises as much to the University conducting the Turney.

### SECTION XI.

The details of the Series, such as protests, eligibility lists, schedules, etc., are to be cared for by the State Board of Control.

### SECTION XII.

The University representative shall send by telegram the names of the winning schools to A. L. Trester, LaPorte, Indiana, as soon as the Series is completed. The University representative shall also send to A. L. Trester on or before Monday, March 14, the complete scores of all games on and all entry blanks. A complete and itemized statement of receipts and disbursements shall be sent on or before Thursday, March 17.

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## ARTICLES OF CONTRACT

LaPorte, Indiana, November 22, 1920.

The following Articles of Agreement are subscribed to by the Indiana High School Athletic Association through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, and K. V. Ammerman, representing "The Indianapolis High Schools."

### SECTION I.

The dates of the Indiana High School Basket Ball Tourney shall be March 18 and 19, 1921 at Indianapolis, Indiana, on the Coliseum Floor.

### SECTION II.

The High School Board of Control through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, shall furnish K. V. Ammerman with lists of qualified teams and the names of the men on the respective teams, on or before March 16, 1921.

### SECTION III.

K. V. Ammerman shall provide free entertainment for the respective teams of eight men each, together with one rubber and one Faculty Manager for each team, between the hours of 4:00 p. m. Thursday, March 17, and 8:00 a. m. Sunday, March 20. The Indianapolis High Schools through K. V. Ammerman shall pay the traveling expenses of the competing teams or such part thereof as one-half of the net receipts will permit. By traveling expenses is meant reasonable mileage only.

### SECTION IV.

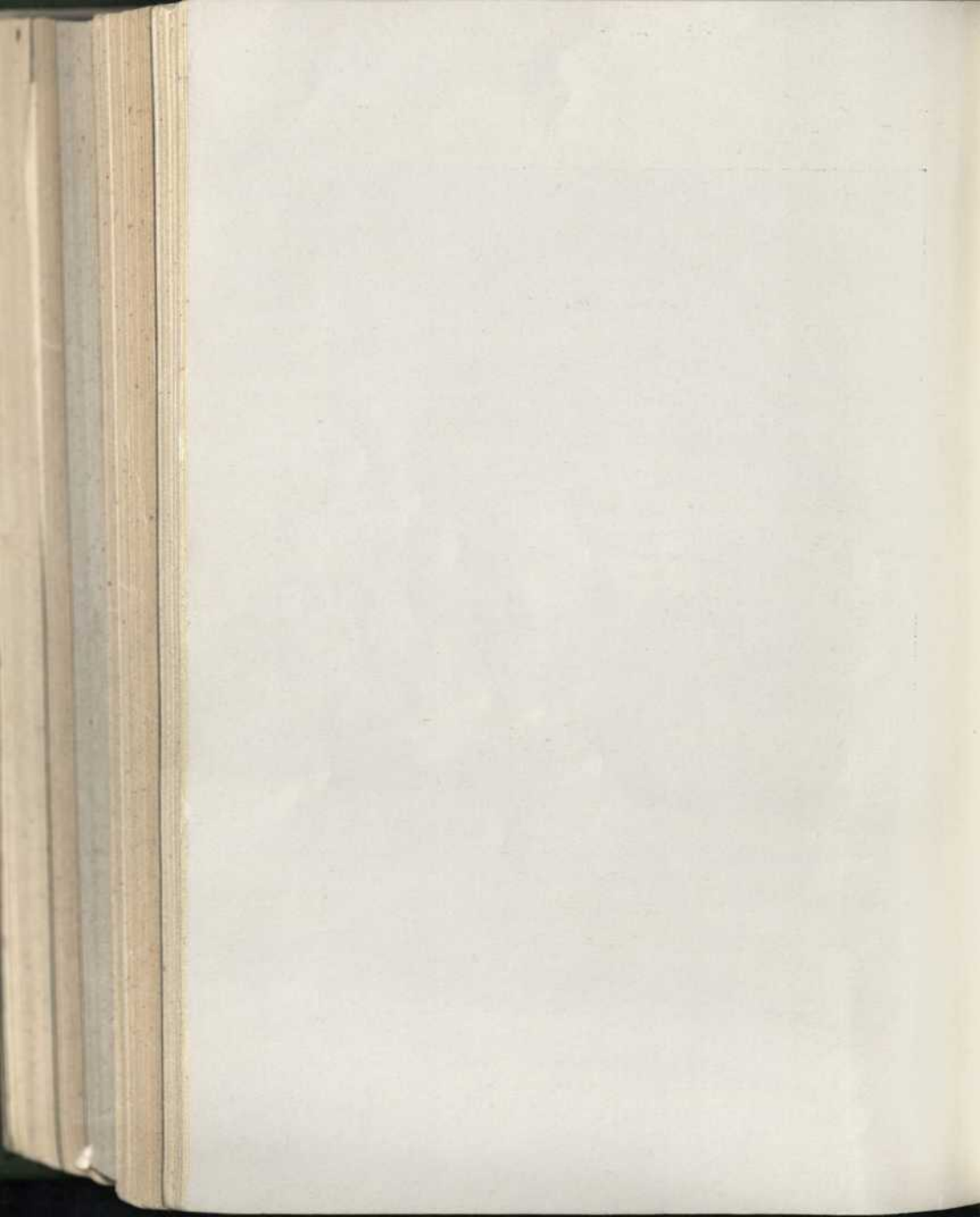

## TRACK AND FIELD

### Detailed Announcement for Track and Field Meets, 1921

In accordance with the vote of the State Association at the last annual meeting, the Board of Control has completed the details for the State Sectional and Final Track and Field Meets. The scheme in full follows:

#### ELIGIBILITY

Each contestant in these meets must have previously made, in a fair test, a record equal to the following in every event in which he is entered:

100 Yard Dash .....	11s.
220 Yard Dash .....	26s.
440 Yard Dash .....	58s.
Half Mile Run .....	2 min. 20s.
Mile Run .....	5 min. 15s.
120 Yard High Hurdles .....	19s.
220 Yard Low Hurdles.....	29s.
Running High Jump .....	.5 ft.
Running Broad Jump .....	19 ft.
Pole Vault .....	8 ft. 9 in.
Putting Shot (12 lb.) .....	36 ft.

The above, together with a mile relay, will constitute the events of the Meets. Winning first place in any event counts five points; second place, three points; and third place, one point. Points in the relay will not be counted in determining the winning team. In case of a tie in any event the points shall be divided as the place awarded by lot.

The order of events is as follows:

**Track Events**—100-yard dash trial; 120-yard hurdle trial; 100-yard dash final; one-mile run; 440-yard run; 120-yard hurdle final; 220-yard dash trial; 220-yard hurdle trial; 880-yard run; 220-yard dash final; 220-yard hurdle final; relay.

**Field Events**—Running high jump; shot put; pole vault; running broad jump.

#### SECTIONAL TRACK AND FIELD MEETS MAY 14.

The following bases were used in selecting centers:— (1) Location—geographical with reference to schools desiring to participate.

(2) Transportation accommodations. (3) General conditions—attitude of local authorities, tracks, fields, entertaining facilities, etc. (4) Existing organizations.

Schools have been assigned by counties, and the following scheme gives the Centers and the counties assigned to each Center. The name of your county locates your Center. The Board reserves the right to readjust the scheme, if necessary. The numbers indicate the schools from each county that have expressed a desire to enter. Entry blanks are necessary, however.

**Management**—The management of these meets rests solely with the Board of Control. Local arrangements have been delegated to the Center Principals. All officials will be selected by the Center Principal.

The Center Principal shall arrange a program for his Meet from the list of entries sent to him by the Permanent Secretary. All Meets shall begin at 1:00 o'clock, and follow the order of events here given. Places on the track must be assigned by lot. The rules of the Western Inter-Collegiate Amateur Athletic Association, published by Spalding shall govern except in cases of modification by the Board of Control. These rules as adopted by the Board, may be found in the I. H. S. A. A. Hand Book.

**Open Contest**—These Meets are open to all members of the Association irrespective of their season's record.

**Protests**—All protests against teams or individuals must be made in writing and filed with the Permanent Secretary on or before May 4, at 11 a. m.

Protests must be accompanied by evidence.

**Entertainment**—Two men for each event, four men for the relay team and a faculty manager from each competing school will be entertained by the Center Principal. Entertainment will begin, if necessary, at 9 a. m. Saturday, May 14, and continue, if necessary, to 3 p. m. Saturday, May 14. All competing schools are requested and expected to ask for no longer entertainment than is necessary. Only actual contestants and faculty manager from each school will be entertained.

The Bloomington Meet will begin at 9:00 a. m. and entertainment will begin Friday evening.

**Expenses**—An entrance fee of One (1) Dollar for each team must accompany the entry blank to be retained by the I. H. S. A. A. Traveling expenses must be paid by the competing schools.

**Privileges**—All competing teams, one rubber and one faculty manager for each team, are to be admitted free to the Meets.

**Eligibility**—The eligibility of each player must be certified to by the Principal of the school sending the team. The regular blank of the I. H. S. A. A. must be used, and all data must be given. Entries positively will close Wednesday, May 4. This means that they must be in the hands of the Permanent Secretary, complete in every detail, on that date.

**Admission Fee**—The admission fee to all Meets shall be fifty (50) cents.

**Prizes**—Suitable ribbons shall be given to the winners of first, second and third places in each event, and to each member of the winning relay team.

**Warnings**—Entries close Wednesday, May 4, and cannot be changed afterwards. An entry fee of One (\$1) Dollar for each team must accompany the entry blank. Special privileges will be granted to no one. Send all entry blanks and money to the Permanent Secretary.

#### **FINAL MEET, FRANKLIN COLLEGE, SATURDAY, MAY 21**

**Entrants**—The winning relay team and all men in the first and second places in each event in the Sectional Meets shall constitute the participants in the final Meet. One entry fee and one entry blank covers both the sectional and final Meets.

**Entertainment**—Franklin College has contracted with the Board to entertain all contestants according to the plan given above. Entertainment will begin, if necessary, at 6 p. m. Friday, May 20, and continue, if necessary, to 8 a. m. Sunday, May 22. All competing schools are requested and expected to ask for no longer entertainment than is necessary. Traveling will be at the expense of the competing schools.

**Admission Fee**—The admission fee to the Meet shall be fifty (50) cents.

**Management**—The management, protests and privileges will be governed according to the regulations pertaining to the Sectional Meets.

**Prizes**—Franklin College will award the winning school, a shield; the winning relay team, a plaque; and the point winners, badges.

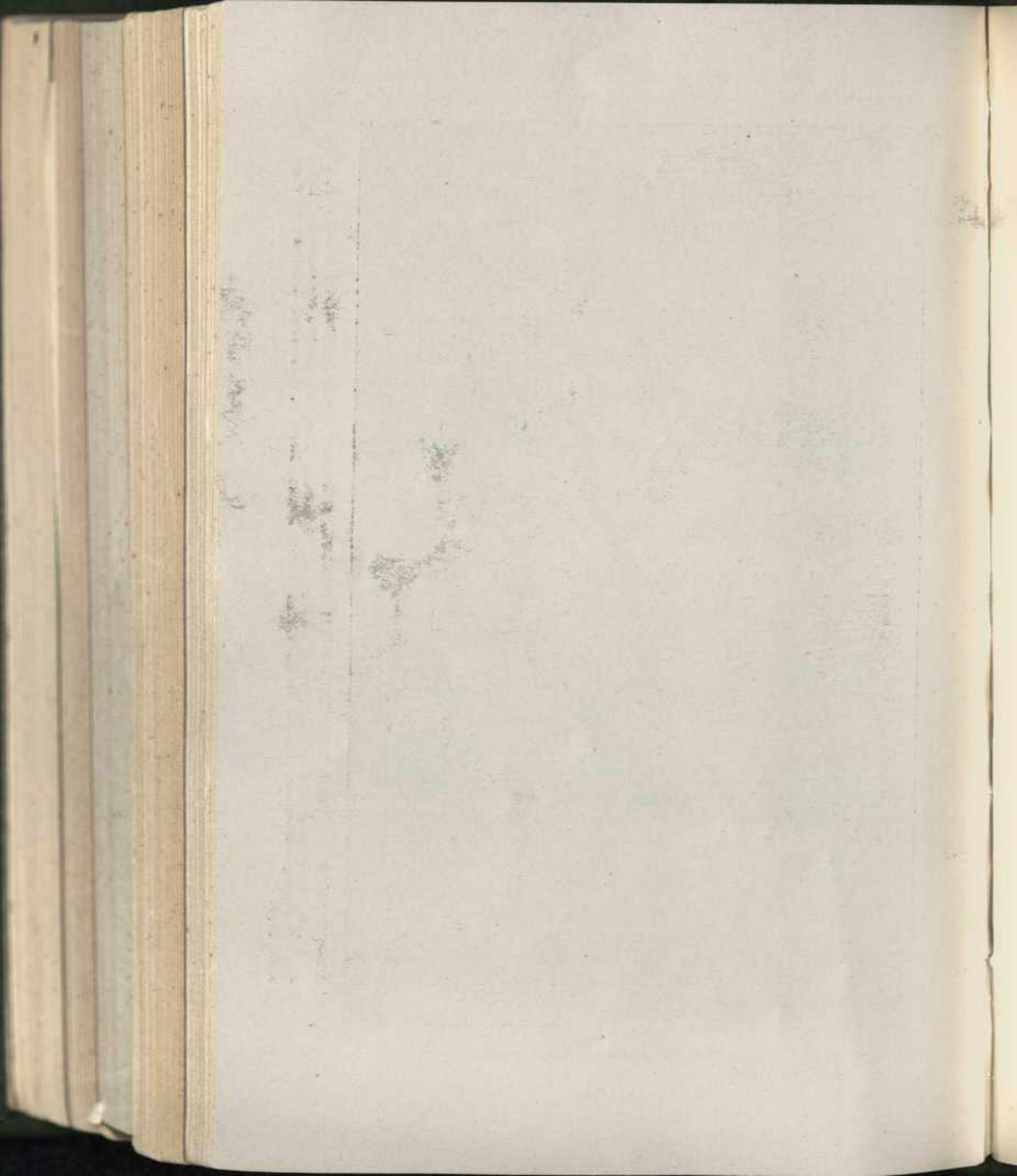

# I. H. S. A. A. TRACK AND FIELD MEET CONTRACT

## ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT

LaPorte, Indiana, .....1921

The following articles of agreement are subscribed to by the Board of Control of the Indiana High School Athletic Association through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary and Principal..... representing ..... High School.

### SECTION I.

The date of the Indiana Sectional High School Track and Field Meets shall be Saturday, May 14, 1921.

### SECTION II.

The State High School Board of Control, through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, shall furnish the High School representative with lists of qualified teams and the names of the men on the respective teams on or before Monday, May 9.

### SECTION III.

The High School representative shall provide free entertainment for the respective teams of four men for the relay team, two men for each event, and a faculty manager for each competing school between the hours of 9:00 a. m. Saturday, May 14, and 8:00 p. m. Saturday, May 14. If possible this period of entertainment will be shortened by the Board of Control.

### SECTION IV.

The High School representative shall provide tickets, announcers, scorers, time-keepers, judges, a referee, a starter, and all necessary equipment and officials for the Meet. He shall select competent men for all positions.

### SECTION V.

The matter of complimentary tickets shall be in the hands of the High School representative, who shall issue them to the Press, the officials, and to the helping students. All men of the competing teams, one rubber, and one Faculty Manager for each team, are to be admitted free to the Meet.

### SECTION VI.

The High School representative shall provide suitable ribbons

for first, second and third winners in each event and for each member of the winning relay team.

SECTION VII.

The admission fee to all Meets shall be fifty (50) cents.

SECTION VIII.

The proceeds of the Meet after meeting items mentioned in the several items of this contract shall belong to the High School holding the Meet.

SECTION IX

The High School under whose auspices the Meet is held promises hearty cooperation with the State Board of Control and the State Board promises as much to the High School conducting the Meet.

SECTION X

The details of Meets such as protests, eligibility lists, schedules, etc., are to be cared for by the State Board of Control.

SECTION XI

The State Board of Control shall manage all Meets and the High Schools are to work under their direction.

SECTION XII.

The High School representative shall send a complete program of the Meet containing all winners, records, distances, etc., by special delivery immediately after the close of the Meet, Saturday, May 14, to John Thurber, Franklin College, Franklin, Indiana, and also to the Permanent Secretary. This is very necessary for final Meet purposes. A complete and itemized statement of receipts and disbursements shall be sent to the Permanent Secretary on Monday, May 16.

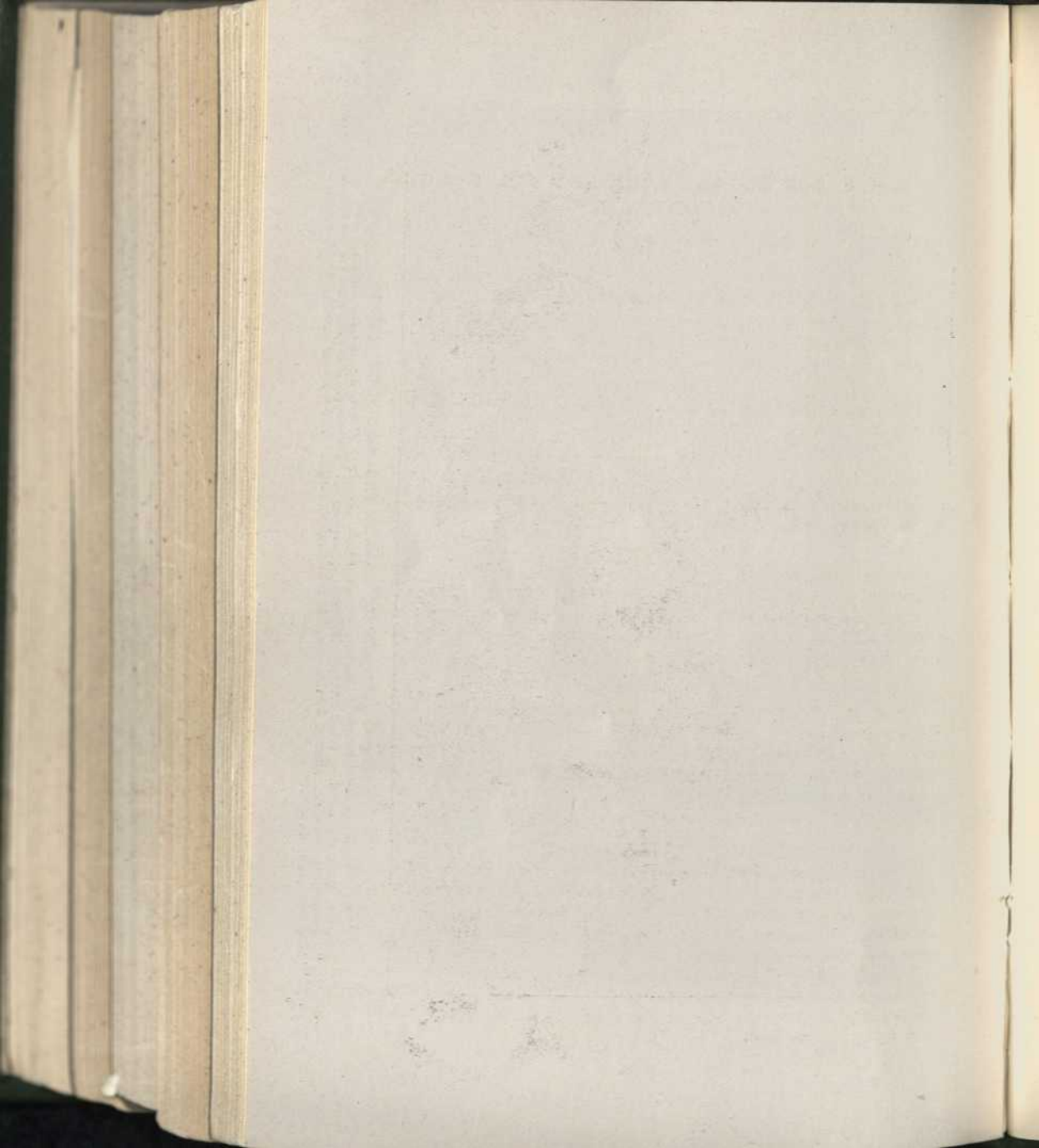

## I. H. S. A. A. FINAL TRACK AND FIELD MEET CONTRACT

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LaPorte, Indiana, April 4, 1921.

The following Articles of Agreement are subscribed to by the Indiana High School Athletic Association through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, and Prof. John Thurber representing Franklin College.

### SECTION I.

The date of the Meet shall be Saturday, May 21, 1921 and the beginning time shall be 1:00 o'clock p. m.

### SECTION II.

The I. H. S. A. A. shall furnish Prof. John Thurber with lists of qualified participants and the events in which they are qualified on or before Monday, May 16, 1921.

### SECTION III.

Prof. John Thurber shall provide entertainment for all of the men in the 1st and 2nd places in the Sectional Meets; for five men constituting the winning relay team in each Sectional Meet; and for a Faculty Manager for each school represented, between the hours of 6 p. m. Friday, May 20 and 8 a. m. Sunday, May 22.

### SECTION IV.

Prof. John Thurber shall provide tickets, gate men, announcers, scorers, timekeepers, judges and all necessary equipment for the Meet. He shall further provide a cup or shield for the winning school, a plaque for the winning Relay team, and medals of gold, silver and bronze for the winners of first, second, and third places respectively in each event. No other prizes shall be given by anyone.

### SECTION V.

The matter of complimentary tickets shall be in the hands of Prof. John Thurber, who shall issue them to the Press, officials, participants, helping students and Faculty Managers. The members of the Board of Control shall be furnished with at least 12 reserved seats near the finishing line.

The Board of Control has gone on record against the presence of coaches and other representatives from Colleges and Universities proselyting at the contests of the I. H. S. A. A. Such is not to be permitted at this Meet.

#### SECTION VI.

The I. H. S. A. A. shall sanction the choice of Referee and Starter selected by Franklin College.

#### SECTION VII.

The admission fee shall be fifty (50) cents to all.

#### SECTION VIII.

Franklin College shall keep any balance and stand any deficit incurred by the Meet.

#### SECTION IX.

An itemized financial statement covering all receipts and disbursements shall be filed with A. L. Trester when final settlement is made.

#### SECTION X.

The events and order of events shall be as listed in the 1920 Hand Book of the I. H. S. A. A. and the rules therein shall govern.

#### SECTION XI.

Traveling will be entirely at the expense of the competing schools.

#### SECTION XII.

The general management shall rest with the I. H. S. A. A. but all local arrangements shall be in the hands of Franklin College.

## MINUTES OF MEETINGS OF BOARD OF CONTROL

### BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING, OCTOBER 21, 1920.

The Board of Control met in the Odd Fellows Hall, Indianapolis, October 21, 1920,— all members and the Permanent Secretary being present.

The Orland-LaGrange controversy was re-considered and the penalty remained the same as formerly announced.

Morocco was suspended from the I. H. S. A. A. until January 1, 1921, for having played ineligible boys in football.

Argos was suspended from the I. H. S. A. A. until January 1, 1921, for having played an ineligible boy in baseball.

The salary of the Permanent Secretary was placed at \$1,000 per year and he was authorized to secure sufficient clerical help and to pay for same out of the I. H. S. A. A. funds.

The following calendar was adopted:

Sectional Basket Ball Tourneys, March 4 and 5. Centers to be selected.

State Basket Ball Tourney, March 10, 11 and 12 at the Coliseum, Indianapolis, under the auspices of the three Indianapolis High Schools.

Sectional Track Meets, May 14. Centers to be selected.

State Track Meet, May 21. Centers to be selected.

### ANNUAL MEETING, OCTOBER 21, 1921.

The Annual Meeting of the I. H. S. A. A. was held in the Odd Fellows Hall in Indianapolis at 2 p. m. Thursday, October 21. There were voting representatives present and more than 100 visitors.

The minutes of the last meeting were not read since they appeared in the 1919 Hand Book.

Indiana University, Purdue University and the Indianapolis High Schools invited the Association to hold the State Basket Ball Tourney under their auspices. The vote stood 116 for Indianapolis, 101 for Purdue and 77 for Indiana.

The following resolution was passed: "No High School shall be

permitted to employ a coach or athletic director who received any extra pay, salary, gifts, trophies, trips or presents from any outside sources."

It was voted by the Association that the Board of Control should strive to lessen the strenuousness of the schedules in all tourneys and if possible to limit the number of teams in the State Tourney to sixteen.

The Permanent Secretary offered his resignation to the meeting but it was voted unanimously not to accept it.

The Board of Control was given authority to expend such money as is necessary to properly conduct the affairs of the I. H. S. A. A.

### I. H. S. A. A. BOARD MEETING

The I. H. S. A. A. Board of Control met in the Claypool Hotel, Indianapolis, at 10 a. m. Saturday, November 20. K. C. Ammerman, Merle Abbett, James Leffel, C. C. Carson and the Permanent Secretary were present.

Evidence was given by the parties concerned in the Amo-North Salem controversy and the Board unanimously declared Frank Trotter of the North Salem High School ineligible for any form of athletics in the I. H. S. A. A. until June 1, 1921. It was shown that this student struck the referee after a game between Amo and North Salem at North Salem.

The Orleans-Smithville controversy was considered and the decision of the referee in forfeiting the game to Smithville was sustained. The Permanent Secretary was instructed to warn Orleans about their rough style of playing on the part of Ellis, the Captain, in particular.

In the Holton-Versailles controversy a boy by the name of Matthews was declared ineligible for all athletics until June 1, 1921; the scheduled contest between Holton and Versailles was declared "no game"; and Versailles was ordered to pay Holton \$5.00 for traveling expenses on or before November 26 under penalty of suspension.

The following scheme was adopted for the State Basket Ball Tourneys this year:

1. An arrangement for 32 tourneys to be held in centers to be selected by dividing the State into four regions of eight tourneys each, these tourneys to be called sectional tourneys.

2. An arrangement for two of these regions to play a series of eight games at some University and for the other two regions to play a series of eight games at another University. These series to be known as semi-final regional Tourneys.

3. An arrangement for the 16 winners in the semi-final regional Tourney to constitute the participants in the State Tourney.



The details of the contracts for sectional, semi-final, Regional and State Tourneys were discussed and the Permanent Secretary was authorized to have such contracts negotiated when centers were selected.

Dates for the Tourney were decided upon as follows: Sectional Tourneys, March 4 and 5; Semi-final Regional Series, March 12; State Tourney, March 18 and 19.

It was decided to pay the officials at Sectional and Semi-final regional tourneys \$50.00 only and to pay the State Tourney officials \$75.00 only for their services. The price of session and season tickets for the sectional and final tourneys was placed at 35 cents and \$1.50 respectively. The prices for session and season tickets for the semi-final regional tourneys was fixed at 50 cents and \$1.00 respectively.

#### BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING.

The I. H. S. A. A. Board of Control met at 10:00 o'clock in the Claypool Hotel, Indianapolis, December 28th. All members of the Board, the Permanent Secretary, and the two new members, Mr. Shock and Mr. Busenburg, were present.

The following cases were decided:

BLOOMFIELD and LINTON—1. The game was won by Bloomfield, the score being 14 to 7. 2. All athletic regulations between the two schools suspended until January 1, 1922, except any tourneys and meets arranged by the Board of Control. 3. Resumption of athletic relations can be made after January 1, 1922, by both schools giving proper assurances to the Board.

SPURGEON-VELPEN—1. The contest on December 3 was declared "no game." 2. The Board recommends that Spalding's rules be followed by both schools.

SHELBYVILLE.. Woodford Richeson declared ineligible on account of age and Principal Kibbey notified to forfeit all games to the opponents played by his High School this year in which Richeson participated.

MISHAWAKA and SOUTH BEND—1. All athletic relations between the two schools suspended until January 1, 1922 except in tourneys and meets arranged by the Board of Control. 2. Resumption of athletics after January 1, 1922, can be made by proper assurances by both schools. 3. The Board is of the opinion that the game was very unsatisfactory, that the publicity was not on a high plane and that the school authorities should use their best efforts in trying to have all games reported correctly. 4. The game was won by Mishewaka and the referee was sustained in his decisions.

The invitations to hold Sectional Basket Ball Tourneys were gone over and authority was given the Permanent Secretary to choose such

centers as the number of schools desiring to participate might require.

The names and officiating of officials over the State were discussed and the Permanent Secretary was authorized to make contracts with sufficient officials for the Tourneys.

The Board decided that the Basket Ball season should end with the State Tourney and that no post games should be played.

The reorganization of the Board resulted as follows: Mr. Abbott, President and Mr. Leffel, Treasurer.

The Permanent Secretary presented contracts signed by both parties with Purdue, Indiana and Indianapolis.

The Montmorenci-Wolcott contest was called "no game."

The entry blanks were gone over and all entries were rejected unless they were mailed on or before February 21. The post marks on the envelopes was taken as evidence here.

The assignment of tourney officials was made by the Board.

All schedules for the sectional, regional and final tourneys were drawn by lot by the Board of Control.

The referee was sustained in the Lyons and Oolitic controversy.

The Mt. Comfort-Fortville controversy was continued on account of a lack of evidence.

The details of all tourneys were gone over and decided.

The Mays-Falmouth controversy was dismissed because official contracts had not been used for the contested game.

The Swayzee High School was ordered to pay the Converse High School \$10.00 forfeit money on or before April 4 under penalty of suspension until June 1, 1922 if not paid.

The Mt. Comfort-Fortville controversy was decided by stating that the referee was in error in granting two points to the Fortville team when a cap was thrown on the field of play, and by stating that the game should go to Fortville because of the sportsmanship shown by Fortville in granting time out three or four times to the Mt. Comfort team when one of their players was injured.

Representatives from Zionsville and Plainfield were present and upon complete investigation Plainfield was excused from all blame in the Zionsville-Plainfield game.

The protest of the Covington-Pine Village game was decided by sustaining the referee.

The Fisher's Oaklandon controversy was decided by suspending all athletic relations between the two schools until June 1, 1922, except in Tourneys and Meets scheduled by the Board of Control, and a warning was also given to both schools.

The Seymour-Scottsburg controversy was decided by sustaining the decisions of the referee.

The Warren High School was instructed to forfeit all games to the opposing schools in which Robert Laymon participated in during this year because of his ineligibility.

The Board of Control discussed the following points with a view to presenting some definite suggestions to the next annual meeting of the Principals:

1. Number of Basket Ball games in a season.
2. County Tournaments.
3. Playing on Y. M. C. A. teams when using the same gymnasium.
4. Gambling.
5. Intensity of Tourneys and playing schedules.

The Greencastle-Rockville protest was considered by the Board and it was decided to sustain the referee in his first decision thus giving the game to Greencastle.

#### BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING.

Indianapolis, Indiana, June 18th, 1921.

The I. H. S. A. A. Board of Control met in the office of Superin-

tendent Hines in the State House to discuss with him and Mr. Wetherow what points of athletic work should be included in the requirements for classifying High Schools by the State Department.

Mr. Wetherow and Mr. Ammerman were appointed to form a committee to draw up some statements giving the points in question and were instructed to submit their statements to each member of the I. H. S. A. A. Board and to Supt. Hines.

The Edinburg High School was suspended from the I. H. S. A. A. until January 1, 1922 for playing an ineligible boy on their base ball team. Edinburg had been previously notified to forfeit the games to the opposing teams in which this boy participated.

#### ANNUAL MEETING, OCTOBER 20, 1921.

There were more than 300 voting representatives and as many more visitors present. After considerable discussion over the distribution of the proceeds of sectional tourneys it was voted to leave this matter in the hands of the Board of Control with the understanding that an equitable distribution be made by the Board.

A resolution was passed to the effect that all proposed amendments must be presented to the Permanent Secretary in writing in time to have them printed and sent to all members of the I. H. S. A. A. prior to the annual meeting.

By vote it was decided to hold sectional, regional and State Basket Ball tourneys, the regional tourneys to be held at Purdue and Indiana and the State Tourney to be held at Indianapolis.

The arrangements of the Track Meets were left in the hands of the Board of Control.

Several other resolutions were offered but all were placed on the table by vote of the members.

J. E. Gilroy chosen a member of Board until next election from District 1. Joseph Shock, the member elected, is not teaching in the Public Schools. J. E. Gilroy received the next largest number of votes to Joseph Shock at the last election.

State Basket Ball Tourney, March 17 and 18 at Coliseum, Indianapolis.

North Manchester College and the State School for the Deaf denied memberships in the I. H. S. A. A.

In all girls' Basket Ball, Spalding's rules for girls shall be used. The three-court plan will be used unless mutual consent to play otherwise is given. Under no consideration may girls play under boys' rules.

The Board went on record as opposed to "curtain raisers" played by High School teams before College games.

Joseph Dienhardt and Charles Tilton of Lafayette declared eligible for foot ball and ineligible for basket ball due to enrollment.

It was decided to pay officials for Basket Ball Tourneys as follows: Sectional, \$50.00; Regional, \$50.00, and State, \$75.00.

**Rules of the Indiana High School Athletic Association  
Regarding Track and Field Meets**

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**Based On the Rules of the Intercollegiate Conference Athletic  
Association.**

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**RULE I.**

**Officials.**

Section 1. All meetings must be under the direction of  
The Board of Control.  
One referee.  
Two or more inspectors.  
Three or more field judges.  
Three or more timekeepers.  
One starter.  
One scorer.  
One marshal.

Section 2. If deemed necessary, assistants may be provided for  
the clerk of the course, the scorer and the marshal, and an official  
announcer may be appointed.

**RULE II.**

**The Board of Control.**

The Board of Control shall have jurisdiction of all matters not  
assigned by these rules to the referee or other game officials.

**RULE III.**

**The Referee.**

\* The referee must decide all questions relating to the actual con-  
duct of the Meet, whose final settlement is not otherwise covered by  
these rules, and shall have the power to add to or alter the announced  
arrangements of heats in any event. A referee has no authority,  
after heats have been drawn and published in a program, to transfer  
a contestant from one heat to another.

When in any but the final heat of a race a claim of foul or interference is made, he shall have the power to disqualify the competitor who was at fault, if he considers the foul intentional or due to culpable carelessness, and shall also have power to allow the hindered competitor to start in the next round of heats, just as if he had been placed in his trial.

When in a final heat a claim of foul or interference is made, he shall have the power to disqualify the competitor who was at fault, if he considers the foul intentional or due to his carelessness or conduct, and he shall also have the power to order a new race between such of the competitors as he thinks entitled to such a privilege.

If during the athletic contest under the rules of the I. H. S. A. A. a competitor shall conduct himself in a manner unbecoming a gentleman or offensive to the officials, spectators or competitors, the referee shall have the power to disqualify him from further competition at the Meet; and if he thinks the offense worthy of additional punishment, must promptly make a detailed statement of the facts to the Board of Control.

Power to change the order of events as laid down in the official program is reserved to the Board of Control, which shall, through its chairman, exercise this authority, unless it sees fit to expressly delegate this power to the referee.

The referee shall not have authority to disqualify any competitor for violation of the eligibility rule of the I. H. S. A. A. All protests as to eligibility made on the field must be referred to the Board of Control, and the protested competitor must be allowed to compete until disqualified by the arbitrator of the I. H. S. A. A.

#### RULE IV

##### **The Inspectors.**

It shall be the duty of the inspector to stand at such point as the referee may designate, to watch the competition closely, and, in case of claim of foul, to report to the referee what he saw of the incident. Such inspectors are merely assistants to the referee, to whom they must report, and have no power to make any decision.

#### RULE V.

##### **The Judges of the Finish.**

The judges of the finish must determine the order of finishing of contestants, and must arrange among themselves as to noting the winner, second, third and fourth, etc., as the case may require, and there must always be two judges, whose duty must be to choose the winner.

Their decision in this respect must be without appeal, and in case of a disagreement a majority must govern.

## RULE VI.

### The Field Judges.

The field judges must make an accurate measurement and keep a tally of all trials of competitors in the high and broad jumps, the pole vaults, the weight competitions and the discus throws.

They must act as judges in these events and their decisions must likewise be without appeal. In case of disagreement, a majority must govern. There must be at least three judges for every event.

## RULE VI.

### The Starter.

The starter must have sole jurisdiction over the competitors after the clerk of the course has properly placed them in their position for the start.

The method of starting must be by pistol report, except that in time handicap races the word "go" must be used.

An actual start is not effected until the pistol has been purposely discharged after the competitors have been warned to get ready.

In case the pistol was not purposely discharged, the competitors shall be called back by the starter by pistol fire.

Note—The starter must have at least two good cartridges in his pistol before starting a heat.

When any part of the person of a competitor touches the ground in front of his mark before the signal is given, it must be considered a false start.

Penalties for false starting must be inflicted by the starter, as follows: In all races to and including 125 yards, the competitor must be put back one yard for the first and another yard for the second attempt; in races over 125 yards and including 300 yards, two yards for the first and two more for the second attempt; in races over 300 yards and including 600 yards, three yards for the first and three more for the second attempt; in races over 600 yards and including 1,000 yards, four yards for the first and four more for the sec-



ond attempt; in races over 1,000 yards and including one mile, five yards for the first and five more for the second attempt; in all races over one mile, ten yards for the first attempt and ten more for the second attempt.

In all cases, the third false start must prevent his competing in that event.

The starter must rule out of that event any competitor who attempts to advance himself from his mark, as perscribed in the official program, after he has been given the warning to "get ready."

#### RULE IX.

##### **Clerk of the Course.**

The clerk of the course must be provided with the names and the numbers of all entered competitors, and he must notify them to appear at the starting line before the start in each event in which they are entered.

#### RULE X.

##### **The Scorer.**

The scorer must record the order in which each competitor finishes his event, together with the time furnished by the referee.

He must keep a tally of the laps made by each competitor in races covering more than one lap, and must announce, by means of a bell or otherwise, when the leading man enters the last lap.

He must draw up a list of the actual competitors in each event, which shall be filed with the papers of the Association, and shall be the official record of competing entrants, and shall be final evidence in the enforcement of Rule III, of the rules of eligibility.

He must control his assistants and assign to them such of his duties as he may deem proper.

#### RULE XI.

##### **The Marshal.**

The marshal must have police charge of the enclosure, and must prevent any but officers and actual competitors from entering or remaining therein.

He must control his assistants and assign to them their duties.

#### RULE XII.

##### **The Official Announcer.**

The official announcer must receive from the scorer and field judges the result of each event, and announce the same by voice or by means of a bulletin board.

#### RULE XIII.

##### **Competitors.**

Competitors must report to the Clerk of the Course immediately upon their arrival at the place of meeting, and must be provided by that official with their proper numbers, which must be worn conspicuously by the competitors when competing, and without which they must not be allowed to start.

Each competitor must inform himself of the time of starting, and must be promptly at the starting point of each competition in which he is entered, and there report to the Clerk of the Course.

Under no condition shall attendants be allowed to accompany competitors at the start or during any competition.

#### RULE XIV.

##### **Track Measurement.**

All distances run or walked must be measured upon a line eighteen inches outward from the inner edge of the track, except that in races on straightaway tracks the distance must be measured in a direct line from the starting mark to the finishing line.

#### RULE XV.

##### **The Course.**

Each competitor must keep in his respective position from start to finish in all races on straightaway tracks, and in all races on tracks with one or more turns, he must not cross to the inner edge of the track, except when he is at least six feet in advance of his nearest competitor. After turning the last corner into the straight in any race, each competitor must run a straight course to the finish line, and must not cross to either the outside or inside from such straight course in front of his opponents.

In all races of the I. H. S. A. A. up to and including 220 yards, each competitor must have a separate course marked out and measured, whether races are run straightaway or with turns.

The referee must disqualify from that event any competitor who willfully pushes against, impedes, crosses the course of, or in any way interferes with another competitor.

The referee must disqualify from further participation in the Meet any contestant competing to lose, to coach, or in any way impede the chances of another competitor, either in a trial or a final contest.

#### RULE XVI.

##### **The Finish.**

The finish of the course must be represented by a line between two finishing posts, drawn across and at right angles to the sides of the track, and four feet above which line must be stretched a tape, attached at either end to the finishing posts. A finish must be counted when any part of the winners body, except his hands or arms, touches the tape at the finishing line. The tape must be considered the finishing line for the winners, but their order of finishing across the track line must determine the position of the other competitors.

## RULE XVII.

### Hurdles.

In the 120 yards hurdle race, ten hurdles must be used, each hurdle to be three feet six inches high. They must be placed ten yards apart, with the first hurdle fifteen yards distant from the starting point, and the last hurdle fifteen yards before the finishing line.

In the 220 yards hurdle race ten hurdles must be used, each hurdle to be two feet six inches high. They must be placed twenty yards apart, with the first hurdle twenty yards distant from the starting mark, and the last hurdle twenty yards before the finishing line.

In making a record it must be necessary for the competitor to jump every hurdle in its proper position.

In all hurdle races of the I. H. S. A. A. up to and including 220 yards, each competitor must have separate hurdles and a separate course marked out and measured, whether races are run straightaway or with turns.

A competitor knocking down three or more hurdles, or any portion of three or more hurdles, in any race shall be disqualified.

## RULE XVIII.

### Jumping.

Section 1. A fair jump must be one that is made without the assistance of weights, diving, somersaults, or handsprings of any kind.

In scratch events competitors must jump in order as placed on program.

Sec. 2. The running high jump.—The field judges must decide the height at which the jump shall commence, and must regulate the succeeding elevations.

Each competitor must be allowed three trial jumps at each height, and if on the third trial he shall fail, he must be declared out of the competition.

Competitors must jump in order, as provided in Section 1; then those failing, if any, must have their second trial jump in a like order, after which those who have failed twice must make their third trial jump.

The jump must be made over a bar resting on pins projecting not more than three inches from the uprights, and when this bar is removed from its place by the competitor when trying, it must be counted as a trial jump.

Running under the bar in making an attempt to jump must be counted as a "balk," and three successive "balks," must be counted as a trial jump.

The distance of the run before the jump must be unlimited. A competitor may decline to jump at any height in his turn, and by so doing forfeits his rights to again jump at the height declined.

Sec. 4. The running broad jump.—When jumped on earth, a joist five inches wide must be sunk flush with it. The outer edges of this joist must be called the scratch line, and the measurement of all jumps must be made

from it, at right angles, to the nearest break in the ground made by any part of the person of the competitor.

In front of the scratch line the ground must be removed to the depth of three and the width of twelve inches outward.

A foul jump must be one where the competitor, in jumping off the scratch line, makes a mark on the ground immediately in front of it, or runs over the line without jumping, and must count as a trial jump without results.

Each Competitor must have three trial jumps, and the best three must have three more trial jumps.

The competition must be decided by the best of all the jumps of the competitors.

The distance of the run before the scratch line must be unlimited.

Sec. 5. The pole vault.- A pole must be furnished by the managing committee, but contestants may use their own private poles if they so desire, and no contestant shall be allowed to use any of these private poles except by the consent of their owners. The poles must be unlimited as to size and weight, but must have no assisting devices, except that they may be wrapped or covered with any substance (to obtain a firmer grip,) and may have one prong at the end.

No competitor shall, during the vault, raise the hand which was uppermost when he left the ground to a higher point of the pole, nor shall he raise the hand which was undermost when he left the ground to any point on the pole above the other hand.

The rules governing the running high jump must also govern the pole vault for height, except when the man leaves the ground in an attempt it shall be counted a trial.

## RULE XIX.

### Putting the Shot.

The shot must be a solid sphere, made of metal, and must weight twelve pounds.

It must be put with one hand, and in making the attempt it must be above, and not behind, the shoulder.

The competitor must stand in a circle seven feet in diameter. The circumference of the circle must be divided into halves by a line drawn through the center of the circle. On four feet of the front half of the circumference a board four inches high must be placed, the edge of which must be equally distant from the intersection of the line with the circumference, and at which the competitor must stand when the shot leaves his hand.

A fair put shall be one where no part of the person of the competitor touches in front of the circle, or on the board, in making the attempt.

A put must be counted as a foul if the competitor steps outside the circle on the board. A competitor must leave the circle by the rear half. Leaving by the front half must be declared a foul.

The measurement of all puts must be made from the nearest mark by the shot to a point on the circumference of the circle on a line with the object mark and the center of the circle.

Foul puts and letting go the shot in making an attempt must be counted as trial puts without results.

A board similar to the one in front may be used at the back of the circle.

The order of competing and the number of trials shall be the same as for the running broad jump. Shots must be furnished by the managing committee. Any contestant may use his own private shot, if correct in weight and shape; in which case the other contestants must be allowed to use it if they wish.

#### RULE XXI.

##### Ties.

In case of a tie in any event, the points shall be divided and the place awarded by lot.

#### RULE XXII.

##### Relay Racing.

1. A line must be drawn twenty feet in front of each starting line. Between these two lines each runner must touch the succeeding runner. Failure to do this disqualifies the team in that event. The judges must see that all touches are properly made.

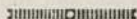
2. The same rule with reference to fouls, coaching or impeding a runner in any way, apply to relay racing as to other events.

3. No member of a relay team can run back of the line, nor can one man run two relays in any team.

# Constitution of the Indiana High School Athletic Association

(Revised Nov. 15, 1916)



## Administration

### Officers:

#### Section 1. Board of Control.

a. The Board of Control shall consist of five members (principals, members of the faculty or superintendents) to represent the five districts into which the State is divided for administration purposes only.

b. Elections shall take place each year between December 1 and December 10, all votes being mailed to the Permanent Secretary on ballots prepared by him.

c. Each member of the I. H. S. A. A. in a district shall have one vote for a Board member from his district.

d. Beginning with December 1916 members shall be elected as follows: First District, to serve until January 1, 1918; Second District, to serve until January 1, 1919; Third District, to serve until January 1, 1920. The Fourth District will have an election in December 1917, the member to serve three years and the Fifth District will have an election in December 1918, the member to serve three years.

e. After the initial elections each member shall be elected for three years.

f. All newly elected officers shall assume the duties of their offices on the first day of January next following his election.

g. The person receiving the highest number of votes in his district shall be elected.

h. In case of a tie the vote shall be taken again, the votes being cast for the men who are tied for first place.



i. Three members of the Board shall constitute a quorum at any meeting.

j. Removal from the district or withdrawal from the teaching profession shall constitute a vacancy and in such cases the remaining members on the Board shall choose a person from the district wherein the vacancy exists to serve until the next election only.

k. No retiring member of the Board, having served three years, shall be eligible for re-election in any district for a period of one year after date of retirement.

## Sec. 2. I. H. S. A. A. Districts.

For the purposes of administration only the State shall be divided by Counties into the following districts:

**First District**—Benton, Carroll, Cass, Fulton, Jasper, Lake, Laporte, Marshall, Newton, Porter, Pulaski, Starke, St. Joseph, Tippecanoe, White.

**Second District**—Adams, Allen, Blackford, Dekalb, Elkhart, Grant, Howard, Huntington, Kosciusko, LaGrange, Miami, Noble, Steuben, Wabash, Wells, Whitley.

**Third District**—Boone, Clay, Clinton, Fountain, Hamilton, Hendricks, Marion, Montgomery, Morgan, Owen, Parke, Putnam, Tipton, Vigo, Vermillion, Warren.

**Fourth District**—Bartholomew, Dearborn, Decatur, Delaware, Fayette, Franklin, Hancock, Henry, Jay, Jefferson, Jennings, Johnson, Madison, Ohio, Randolph, Ripley, Rush, Shelby, Switzerland, Union, Wayne.

**Fifth District**—Brown, Clark, Crawford, Daviess, Dubois, Floyd, Gibson, Green, Harrison, Jackson, Knox, Lawrence, Martin, Monroe, Orange, Perry, Pike, Posey, Scott, Spencer, Sullivan, Vanderburg, Warrick, Washington.

Sec. 3. The Board of Control shall have the following powers and duties: (a) It shall have general control over all athletic contests between secondary schools in this Association, (b) It shall have exclusive control of the annual Inter-scholastic Meet; (c) It shall give interpretations of the rules of the Association; (d) It shall determine forfeitures under Sec. 11; (e) The Board of Control, at the end of any athletic season may, at its discretion, issue a statement of its official opinion as to the relative standing of teams. No school which has violated the rules of the Association in regard to the qualifications of players shall be awarded special honors in that particular branch of athletics.

Sec. 4. (a) When charges are made in writing by a member of the Association against another member for violation of the rules of the Association, the Board of Control, after giving due notice of the place and time for the school so charged to be heard, shall consider such charges, and may suspend the offending school for a period not exceeding one year. (b) The Board of Control shall decide upon all protests brought before it with reference to qualifications of contestants in the Inter-scholastic Meet. (c) When any matter comes before the Board for decision which is of special interest to a school of which a member of the Board is a representative, the remaining members shall appoint another person to act in his place in that matter.

Sec. 5. At the annual meeting of 1906 a **Permanent Secretary** shall be elected, who shall have charge of the property and records of the Association; shall receive all money for dues and the sale of publications of the Association; shall issue all circulars authorized by the Board of Control; shall attend meetings of the Board when requested to do so by the Board; shall turn over to the Treasurer of the Board all money in his possession when called upon to do so; shall perform such other duties as the growth of the Association as determined by the Board may require; and shall receive as compensation the sum of \$150 annually, and such allowances for expenses and clerical help as the Board may approve. Vacancies in the office may be declared by the Board for cause, and a successor appointed by the Board to act until the next annual meeting.

It shall be the duty of the Permanent Secretary to publish the I. H. S. A. A. Year Book immediately following the annual meeting of the Association

#### **Local Management:**

Sec. 6. The **Principal** or his authorized representative shall accompany his team to all contests.

Sec. 7. The principal of the school, or high school teachers authorized by him, shall be manager or managers of the teams representing the school.

Sec. 8. No games shall be played without the sanction of the principal.

Sec. 9. The eligibility of all the contestants shall be certified to by the principal of the school in accordance with the rules hereby adopted. Such statements shall be presented in writing within ten days before any contest. In case of disputes the principal must furnish the Board of Control the following data in regard to each contestant: The date of last enrollment; the number of years he has been a member of a secondary school athletic team; date and place of birth; average mark in each study for the last preceding term in school; average mark in each study from the beginning of the current term or semester. A school which does not furnish this data shall be denied championship honors, and may be excluded from the Annual Inter-scholastic meet.

Sec. 10. The principal has power and is advised to exclude any contestant who, because of bad habits or improper conduct, would not represent his school in a becoming manner.

Sec. 11. It is recommended that principals, in arranging for games, provide a forfeit of \$10, to be exacted should there be a failure on the part of either party to carry out the arrangements made. Should such forfeitures be stipulated and not be paid during the same season, the Board of Control, after hearing both sides, shall have authority to expel the delinquent school from the Association. Notification of such expulsion shall be published in the papers, with cause therefor.

Sec. 12. **Paid Coaches**, other than those regularly employed as teachers by the trustees of the school, are prohibited. By paid coach is meant any person who receives, directly or indirectly, remuneration of any kind, money, traveling expenses, gifts, etc., in return for services rendered in instructing or coaching any high school athletic team.

Sec. 13. Each school in the Association shall report to the Permanent Secretary a list of pupils representing the school in athletic contests during the year. Each school is asked to report also the kind of treatment accorded them to, from and on the field, while guests of another school.

#### **Officials:**

Sec. 14. On and after January 1, 1910, all the **Major Officials** in all athletic contests participated in by teams connected with schools in the I. H. S. A. A. shall be regularly licensed teachers in the public schools of Indiana or shall be persons whose names have been furnished and approved by the Board of Control. It is recommended that these officials shall be disinterested, and it is required that when a school demands disinterested officials at the time of scheduling the game, such officials shall be furnished. The Board shall drop from its list of approved officials any person who is palpably unfair and biased in his decision in games.

Sec. 15. Non-playing student officials or assistants shall conform to the same rules as the players.

#### **Membership:**

Sec. 16. Membership in this Association shall be limited to public High Schools of the state, and each school shall have one vote. The annual dues shall be \$1.50, payable when the school becomes a member, and thereafter by January 1 of each year, in advance.

Academies with commissioned high school standing shall be eligible to membership in the Association, and wherever the word "high school" appears in this Constitution it shall be understood to apply equally to these academies.

Beginning with the year 1914, and every year thereafter, the fiscal year of the Indiana High School Athletic Association shall close on December 31.

### **Games and Game Rules:**

Sec. 17. No games shall be played with high schools of this state not belonging to the Association.

This rule does not prevent a member of the Association from playing high school teams outside of the state, nor from playing non-high school teams within the state, except as follows:

It is a violation of the Constitution for schools in the Association to play non-high school teams including high school boys, unless the latter are certified as eligible by the Principal of the school to which they belong.

Sec. 18. The games recognized by the I. H. S. A. A. shall be: Football, Rugby Football, Soccer, Basketball, Track Work and Baseball. Further, all forms of inter-school athletic games shall be subject to the rules of the I. H. S. A. A.

Sec. 19. In all football contests held under these rules, the length of each half shall be twenty-five minutes, unless changed by mutual consent.

Sec. 20. The basketball rules for boys and girls as published in Spalding's Official Basketball rule books shall be the official rules governing all contests between members of the I. H. S. A. A. The three-court plan shall be used by girls except as mutually agreed upon otherwise. However, the rule governing the selection of officials in the above rules shall be void, and unless otherwise agreed by mutual consent each school shall furnish one official, and these officials shall alternate their duties, each acting as referee and each acting as umpire one half.

### **Eligibility.**

Rule 1. To represent a school in any interscholastic contest, a person must be under twenty-one years of age; must have entered some public high school within the first twenty school days of the semester in which the contest occurs, and must be an amateur as defined by the A. A. U. Eighth grade pupils are not eligible. A semester is one-half a school year.

(The term "Amateur" is defined and explained in Spalding's Official Handbook of the Inter-Collegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America.)

Rule 2. Any pupil who has been enrolled twenty (20) or more days from September 1 to December 1 of same year for each of four semesters will be ineligible to play football a fifth semester.

"Any pupil who has been enrolled for a period of twenty (20) or more days from December 1 to March 1 of the next year for each of four

semesters shall be eligible to play a fifth semester, provided he meets the requirements of the other eligibility rules; provided further that no pupil shall represent his school longer than four years."

INTERPRETATION—This rule applies only to students entering school for the first time during the second semester of the school year, and enrollment in school rather than participation in athletics shall determine the eligibility of all students.

Any pupil who has been enrolled for a period of twenty (20) or more days from March 1 to June 1 of the same year for each of four semesters shall be ineligible to play baseball a fifth semester.

INTERPRETATION—This section covers all branches of athletics.

Rule 3. A pupil withdrawing permanently from school within the first twenty school days of the semester shall not be regarded as having an opportunity to engage in athletics that semester unless he has already played in one or more interscholastic games, in which case he shall be regarded as having engaged in Athletics for that season.

Rule 4. **Post Graduates** are not eligible, but pupils graduating from regular three year courses shall not be deemed post graduates.

Rule 5. A student is a post graduate of a school after he has completed the work required for graduation by that school, irrespective of the time of granting the diploma.

Rule 6. Pupils meeting requirements for graduation in three and one-half years in high schools with regular four years course shall be eligible to participate in school athletics the last half of the fourth year, provided they meet all other eligibility rules of the I. H. S. A. A.

Rule 7. Time spent in athletic sport by pupils while in grades below the high school shall not be counted as part of the four years.

Rule 8. No person shall enter a contest under an assumed name.

Rule 9. Any member of a high school athletic team who participates in an athletic contest as a member of any other similar team the same season, shall be ineligible to compete under these rules for the remainder of that season.

An exception is hereby made for basketball and basketball players in those towns and cities whose schools have no gymnasium and whose students are forced by necessity to use a Y. M. C. A. or some other gymnasium for their practice games. It is a well known fact that the use of such gymnasium by high school students under such circumstances will likely require that such students play on the teams of the organizations

maintaining such gymnasiums. No student, however, will be permitted to play on any other team than that representing the organization controlling the gymnasium, and no student will be allowed to play in the teams of the latter without the knowledge and consent of his principal.

Rule 10. Each contestant must have and be maintaining for the current semester, a passing grade in each of three or more studies requiring a minimum of fifteen regular high school recitations per week, exclusive of rhetorical, physical culture, military drill and deportment; in his last preceding semester in school he must also have met the same requirements throughout the entire term.

Pupils enrolled for the first time must comply with the requirements of the rules, the average standing required for the preceding semester being obtained from the records in the last secondary school attended.

Back work may be made up, providing that it is done in accordance with the regular rules of the school and becomes a matter of final record before the next semester.

INTERPRETATION—In each of the studies representing the minimum requirement of work specified above: (a) For the current semester the average of the monthly grades up to the time of certification must be passing; (b) for the current or school month the average of the daily or weekly grades must be passing; (c) if the average of the monthly grades at the beginning of any month is below passing in any study, the pupil is ineligible as far as that study is concerned for the entire month.

Rule 11. No person who has been enrolled as a student in an institution of college standing, and has done work which may be counted toward a degree in that institution, shall be eligible as a member of any athletic team under I. H. S. A. A. rules in any game with any other team, either within or without the State of Indiana.

Rule 12. The eligibility rules of this Association shall apply to students taking part in all contests, whether with schools inside or outside the State of Indiana.

Rule 13. On and after January 1, 1911, no student shall be eligible to play football unless he has been examined by a regular physician and his physical condition has been pronounced satisfactory. Further, such student shall not be eligible until the physician's certificate has been filed with the Permanent Secretary of the Association. Said certificate shall be good from September 1 to December 1, only.

Rule 14. On and after January 1, 1911, no pupil shall be eligible to play football without the written consent of his father, mother or guardian. Said written consent shall be attested by the Principal or Faculty Manager,

and shall be filed with the Permanent Secretary of the Association. The copy of said written consent shall be attached to the physician's certificate when filed with the Permanent Secretary.

Rule, 15. No student, who has been enrolled as a High School student in any High School, shall be permitted to participate in any inter-high school contest as a member of another high school until he has been enrolled in such high school for one full semester, unless the parents of such student actually change their residence to the second school district. In the latter case the student will be as eligible as he was in the school from which he withdrew.

The resolution is interpreted as follows:

1. Students finishing the courses offered in schools maintaining less than four years of high school work are not bound by the resolution.

2. The fact that a transfer has or has not been issued, or that the student pays or does not pay his tuition has no bearing on the resolution.

3. The resolution is now in force for the present semester but is not retroactive as to penalty.

4. A student enrolled in one High School of a city or school corporation shall not be eligible in another High School of the same city or school corporation until he has been enrolled in the other High School for one full semester.

#### Interpretations.

First. A game is an Inter-High School athletic contest.

Second. The football season is defined as beginning with the opening of school and closing with November 30.

Third. No student who violates the rules of the Association will be reinstated by the Board.

Fourth. A pupil who has played in one or more inter-scholastic games in any season shall be regarded as having engaged in athletics for that season.

Fifth. When a member or members of any team are protested, the game should be played as scheduled and the protest filed with the Board for settlement later.

Sixth. The basketball season is defined as lasting the entire school year.

Seventh. Pupils under twenty-one at the time of registration in school shall be so regarded until the time of their next registration.

Eighth. Any student, who carries at least 15 hours of regular High School work, is a High School student.

Ninth. It is recommended that Principals take proper measures to control the crowd and the players in all contests. Failure to do so shall be considered sufficient grounds for expulsion from the Association.

#### Notes.

1. Parents' and physician's certificates, contracts for all contests, eligibility certificates, blanks for certification of officials, and blanks of reporting contests will be furnished in quantities upon application to the Permanent Secretary. Please state definitely the kind and number of each wanted.

2. The Annual Handbook will be sent upon receipt of ten cents.

3. All correspondence and remittances from members of the Association to the Board of Control or to the Permanent Secretary must be indorsed by the principal, **THE PRINCIPAL IS THE RESPONSIBLE PARTY.**

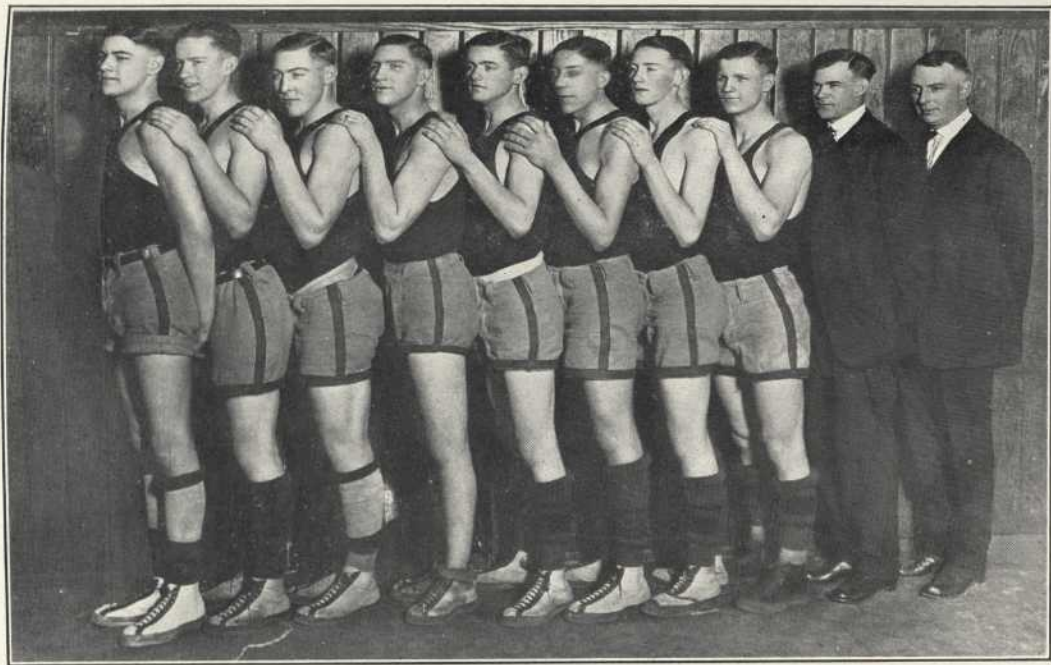

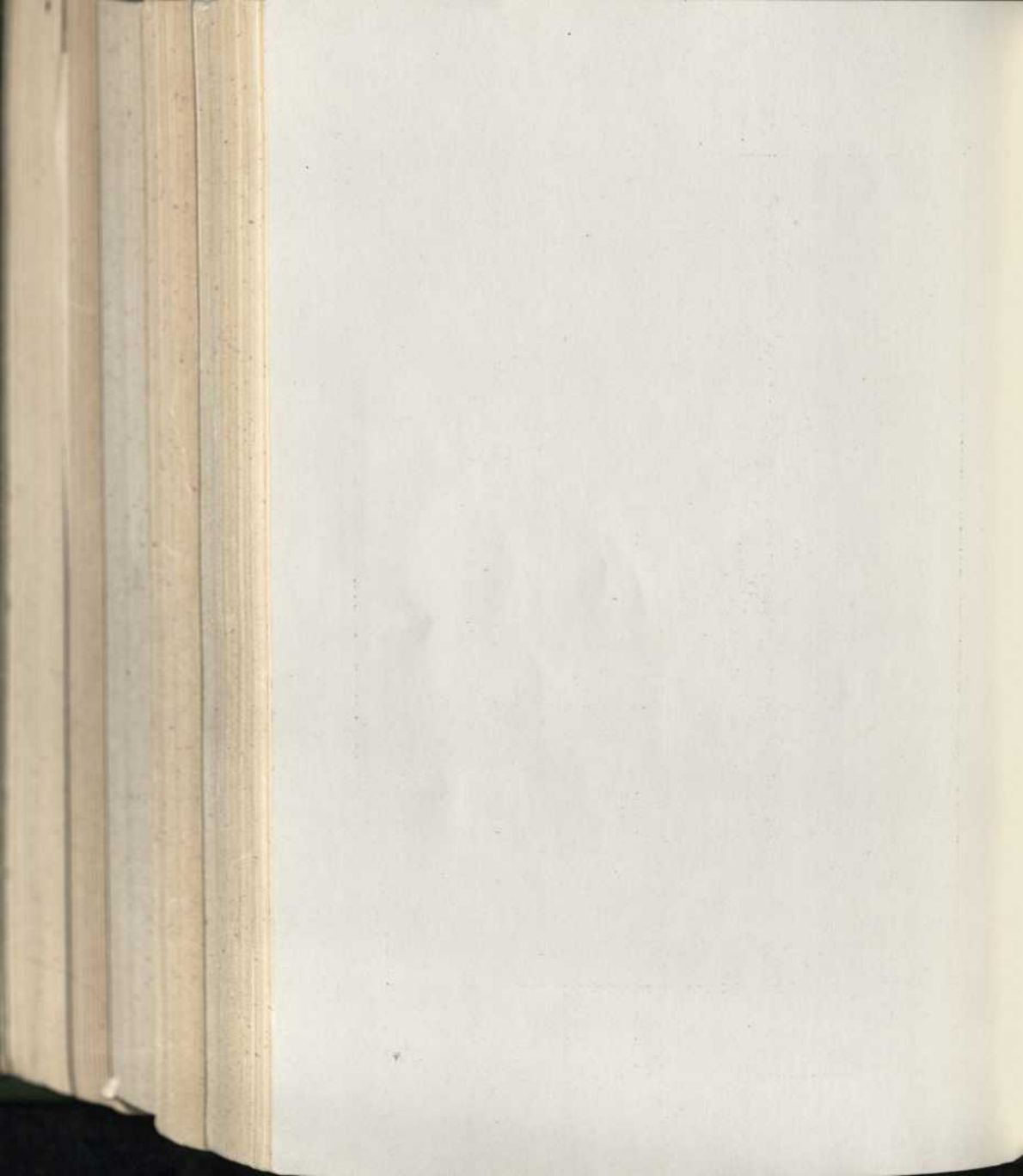
