3) CONSIDERATION FOR APPROVAL – BASKETBALL MERCY RULE PROPOSAL

At all levels of play and in the IHSAA state tournament (except for the state finals), a running clock will be initiated after the first half when one team has a lead of thirty-five (35) points or more. Once the running clock begins, regular timing procedures will not be used for the remainder of the game.

The game clock will run continuously except for the following situations when it will be stopped:

- a. An official's timeout for an injured participant.
- b. A charged (team) timeout occurs.
- c. Intermission between third and fourth quarter.
- d. Anytime a foul is called that will result in free throws.
- e. Anytime officials determine it is necessary for safety reasons.

This rule will take effect with the upcoming 2021-22 boys and girls basketball seasons.

A motion for approval was made by Nathan Dean; seconded by Tim Grove; motion approved 18-0.

REPORTS

4) SOFTBALL COACHES ASSOCIATION PRESENTATION

Kate Todd and Alyssa Coleman, representing the Softball Coaches Association of Indiana, a new organization working on behalf of the sport, appeared before the Executive Committee. They spoke to the group's positive relationship with the Indiana Coaches of Girls Sports Association (ICGSA), plans for its website and communication with schools and coaches.

5) STUDENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE PRESENTATION

IHSAA Student Advisory Committee President TJ Weeks of Eastern (Greentown) and Vice-President Will Retherford of Elwood reported on the group's summer retreat at Jameson Camp in Indianapolis. They also discussed the upcoming quarterly meetings, the Unity Event 2021, involvement in the Champions Together program and set a goal that all 18 members help their schools' earn the Champions Together banner. They also plan to bring back the Student Leadership Conference next summer, create a new Sportsmanship public service announcement, and to attend the NFHS Student Leadership Summit. Assistant commissioners Robert Faulkens and Kerrie Schludecker serve as conveners for the student group.

6) PLANS FOR FALL STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Assistant Commissioner Chris Kaufman detailed the girls golf state finals that completed just before dark last Saturday evening. Other than a two-hour-plus rain delay that hit on the second day, the tournament ran very smoothly.

Regarding the on-going boys tennis state tournament, some teams have been struck by COVID-19 and rain the last several days has wreaked havoc. North Central High School will begin renovation of its tennis courts immediately following the state finals and the singles and doubles state finals, originally scheduled for Park Tudor, will need to be moved to a different venue, due to construction.

Assistant Commissioner Sandra Walter reported on plans for the soccer state finals which returns to Carroll Stadium at IUPUI which has undergone recent renovations and added suites.

Assistant Commissioner Brian Lewis detailed plans for the cross country state tournament which winds up at LaVern Gibson Championship Cross Country Course in Terre Haute.

Assistant Commissioner Kerrie Schludecker will be in Muncie next Monday to discuss the volleyball state finals at Worthen Arena. She will find out what, if any, restrictions, the university will have in place for the event. Start times for the four championship matches will be ironed out to help with teams in attendance and crowd flow.

Robert Faulkens has met with Lucas Oil Stadium personnel and, at this time, does not expect any crowd limitations and restrictions for the football state finals like last year. A digital ticket solution at the venue is being discussed.

7) REPORT ON CHAIR OFFICIALS FOR THE BOYS TENNIS TOURNAMENT SERIES

Assistant Commissioner Chris Kaufman presented a list of USTA chair officials eligible for use in the tennis state tournament series.

8) REPORT ON OFFICIALS FOR THE CROSS COUNTRY TOURNAMENT SERIES

Assistant Commissioner Brian Lewis presented a list of 69 cross country starters eligible for the state tournament series.

9) REPORT ON OFFICIALS FOR THE SOCCER TOURNAMENT SERIES

Assistant Commissioner Sandra Walter presented a list of 357 soccer officials who applied for the state tournament series. This year's state finals will be returning to Carroll Stadium at IUPUI for the six state championship matches.

10) REPORT ON OFFICIALS FOR THE VOLLEYBALL TOURNAMENT SERIES

Assistant Commissioner Kerrie Schludecker submitted a list of 183 volleyball officials who have applied to work the state tournament series as sectionals begin next week.

11) REPORT ON OFFICIALS FOR THE FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT SERIES

Assistant Commissioner Robert Faulkens presented a list of officials who make up 140 football crews who applied to work the state tournament series. Faulkens will begin assigning crews to sectional games next week following this Sunday's pairings show.

12) REPORT ON OFFICIALS FOR THE UNIFIED FLAG FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT SERIES

Assistant Commissioner Robert Faulkens presented a list of 41 applicants being used for the Unified Flag Football State Tournament which plays regional games this Saturday.

13) REPORT ON NFHS SECTION 4 MEETING

Commissioner Paul Neidig recapped hosting this year's NFHS Section 4 meeting on Sept. 22-24 in the IHSAA Office. He discussed various topics with other executives from the states of Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan and Wisconsin as well as the NFHS along with former IHSAA commissioners Bobby Cox and Bob Gardner.

14) REPORT ON MIDWEST OFFICIALS SUMMIT

Assistant Commissioner Sandra Walter reported on the Midwest Officials Summit she attended Sept. 26-28 in Topeka, KS and hosted by the Kansas State High School Activities Association. Twenty-four (24) different states were represented and a few of the topics covered included game assigners, classes for officials, and provisional licenses. She indicated that all states are struggling with the numbers of licensed officials across the board.

15) TRANSFERS

17) OFFICIALS REPORT

Assistant Commissioner Sandra Walter spoke to the annual list of officials license renewals by sport. Soccer numbers have increased by 100.8% and football to 100.6% over last year's numbers while wrestling is the only sport that is down significantly at 86.9%, the only sport below 94%.

18) TECHNOLOGY REPORT

Technology Director Luke Morehead emphasized the importance of working with the IHSAA office to correct any inaccurate coach birth dates in the myIHSAA database before the new coach upload feature can be used. Mr. Morehead will communicate this procedure to all member school athletic offices.

19) IHSAA FOUNDATION QUARTERLY REPORT

Foundation President Matt Wolfert reported that Westfield Superintendent Dr. Paul Kaiser has been named to the Foundation Board of Directors. He also reviewed the 2021-22 goals for funding the Foundation. He mentioned that schools will have the opportunity to donate again at the football sectional level and that a committee is being created to determine criteria and distribution of its grant program. The next meeting of the InSideOut Initiative is set the Wednesday, Oct. 27.

2. The student-athlete was declared ineligible until a completed transfer report was submitted and ruled upon.
3. In accordance with Rule 3-9, the contest(s) in which the ineligible student-athlete participated shall be rescored to remove any team points earned by the ineligible student-athlete and the opposing school(s) shall be notified of this violation.

Switzerland County HS – Rule 18-1 (*A Cross Country student-athlete participated in multiple contests while academically ineligible*)

1. The Switzerland County High School Girls Cross Country program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a member school By-Law violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. The student-athlete involved in this violation shall be declared ineligible for further competition until they meet the minimum standards for eligibility.
3. In accordance with Rule 3-9, the contest(s) in which the ineligible student-athlete participated shall be rescored to remove any points earned by the ineligible student-athlete and the opposing school(s) shall be notified of this violation.
4. Part of an IHSAA member school's obligation is to uphold the By-Laws of its association and furthermore to self-report any violation to the Commissioner (Rule 3).

Tri-County HS – Girls Cross Country - Rule 19-7 (*A student-athlete participated in a Cross Country Meet without an approved Foreign Exchange Student transfer report on file*)

1. The Tri-County High School Girls Cross Country program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a serious rule violation has occurred and shall not be repeated.
2. The student-athlete was declared ineligible until a completed transfer report was submitted and ruled upon.
3. The Cross Country meet the ineligible student athlete participated in shall be forfeited and rescored to remove any points earned by the student athlete if a team score was calculated. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.
4. Part of an IHSAA member school's obligation is to uphold the By-Laws of its association and furthermore to self-report any violation to the Commissioner (Rule 3).

Whitko HS – Football – Rule 19-3 (*A student-athlete participated in multiple interscholastic Junior Varsity Football contests without an approved transfer on file*)

1. The Whitko High School Football program is issued a warning. This warning is notice that an IHSAA member school rule violation has occurred and shall not be repeated.
2. The student-athlete is declared ineligible until a completed transfer report is submitted and ruled upon.
3. The interscholastic contests in which this student-athlete participated in shall be forfeited. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.
4. Part of an IHSAA member school's obligation is to uphold the member school By-Laws of its association and furthermore to self-report any violation to the Commissioner (Rule 3).
